How to Observe Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday:

To help your church support children world-wide so they can reach their full potential, fight against extreme poverty and disease, organize an Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday in support of ONE THOUSAND DAYS OF LOVE.

Here's how:

- Step 1: Speak with your rector or church leadership about observing Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday. Choose the first Sunday in Lent, or any Sunday during the year when you're able to focus attention on the challenges facing children throughout the world.
- **Step 2:** Select a team of people and a leader who can help brainstorm, advertise and organize your Sunday.
- Step 3: Speak with your Episcopal Relief & Development Diocesan Coordinator and let him/her know your church is planning an Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday. If you need your Diocesan Coordinator's email address or phone number, contact our Engagement office at engagement@episcopalrelief.org.
- **Step 4:** Promote the event with a bulletin insert or Sunday service leaflet and on your website. Explain briefly the purpose of Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday. Use the suggested text in this template to help you draft the announcement.

Prior to the event:

- Order pew envelopes and hope chests to collect a special ONE THOUSAND DAYS OF LOVE offering.
- Download bulletin inserts to share additional information about our work with children.
- **Create awareness** by offering information on Episcopal Relief & Development **programs** and the different regions where we work Use this information to educate your church on our worldwide Church partnerships that assist those in need.

On Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday:

- Make an announcement from the pulpit. Take a few minutes to highlight the importance of Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday and the special offering in support of children through ONE THOUSAND DAYS OF LOVE. This can be done by the Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday team, or by another lay leader or the rector.
- Collect a Sunday offering. If you have pew envelopes available, place them in the pews for the special offering. Offerings can also be made using the bulletin insert response form. Let the congregation know about the importance of their contribution.
- Include a special sermon and prayers in your service.
